From the Pastor's Desk / Del Escritorio del Padre

Fear is a highly motivating and energizing force in our lives. Psychology points out the "fight or flight" response from every living organism. This is true about humans and animals. When you feel it hard to when you choose to take off. The energy gathered for operation is determined by the perception of the intensity of the fear factor.

When Jesus tells us "do not fear" He gives the clue to deal with it in order to live in peace.

Fear is eliminated when we reach the rescue. It can be person or place. We cling to whoever can provide safety. Children run to parents, babies to their mothers etc.

Knowing and feeling connected to the source of protection gives us a sense of security.

There are many fears in our lives. Can be illness, loss of relationship or dear ones, economic set back, or even our own death. These are all inevitable in life, only difference is when, where, and how.

Jesus reminds us that true safety is from the Heavenly Father. Have faith in Him, feel connected with Him, do what is pleasing to Him always.

Junio es el mes de la devoción al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Individualmente y la familia juntos hacen oraciones ante la imagen de Jesús.

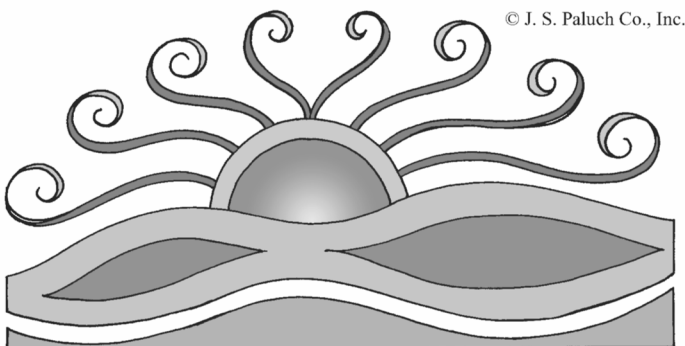
Si vivimos en una buena relación con Jesús todos los días, el miedo a la muerte o al infierno no nos asustará.

THE MESSAGE SEEMS HARSH

On first reading, our Gospel seems very harsh. The idea of taking up our cross can be fearful or have negative connotations, as if it were something only a few can do. It is also confusing. Scripture tells us to honor our father and mother, and yet here are told we must love Jesus more than our parents or children, or we are not worthy. The message that Jesus intends to convey, however, is not to give up these people, but rather to choose Christ first.

Sometimes this means being countercultural. For a family, how do we make choices to keep Christ in the picture? It could mean that when you make plans to take the family to that water park for the weekend, you should also locate the local church so you can attend Mass. Or maybe it means not placing your child on the soccer team with 10 a.m. Sunday games, or rescheduling another part of your life to keep Christ foremost. Perhaps it is something as simple as locking yourself in the bathroom for five minutes so that you have time to pray. Maybe it means listening to an audiobook of scriptures on your commute to work. All we do is for naught if we do not include Christ.



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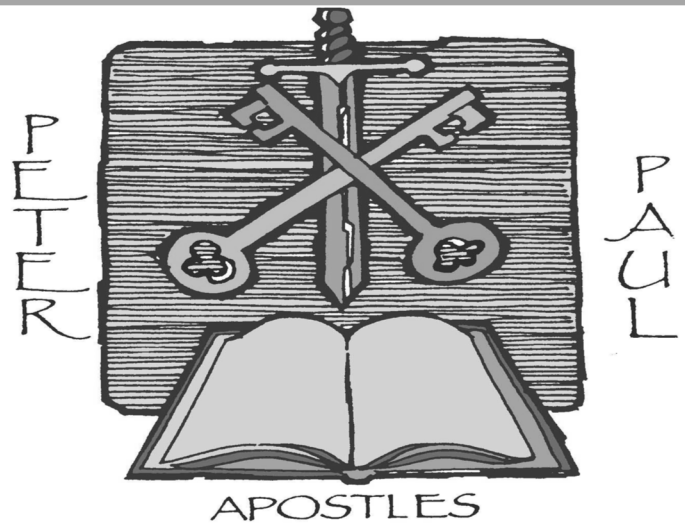

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

SAINT JUNÍPERO SERRA (1713-1784)

July 1

No one who has stood before the quiet majesty of Mission San Juan Capistrano, or the altogether different but no less lovely Mission Dolores in San Francisco, or any of the missions from San Diego to Sonoma can fail to bless the Franciscan padre who, while not founder of each, was inspiration for them all, Saint Junípero Serra. Abandoning the comfortable academic life to which his doctorate in theology entitled him, Serra journeyed to the New World where his tireless traveling, dramatic preaching, and penitential austerity converted thousands of native peoples. Saving souls and celebrating the sacraments were Padre Serra's primary mission but not his only one. Education in letters and crafts, trades and agriculture transformed the people, while roads and irrigation systems transfigured the landscape. His more than thirty years of ministry were not free from conflict with authorities or without controversy in the retrospectively critical eye of history. But when John Paul II beatified him in 1988, he praised Padre Serra for assisting his converts to use their new faith to advance their true human development. — Peter Scagnelli, Copyright © J. S. Sometimes it's difficult to tell where shadow leaves off and light begins. God will take care of that, too.

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TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

San Ireneo (c. 130-200)

28 de junio

Ireneo nació en Esmirna, al occidente de Turquía. Desde joven fue discípulo de Policarpo, quien a su vez fue discípulo del apóstol Juan. Su vinculación a la Iglesia apostólica es directa y eso lo manifestó en su ministerio como obispo y escritor. En sus obras *Contra los herejes*, se preocupó no tanto por atacar a quienes tenían un concepto erróneo de la Iglesia y los misterios de la fe, sino de preservar la autenticidad de la fe cristiana predicada por los apóstoles. Una de las herejías que atacó fue la de los gnósticos, un grupo de cristianos que afirmaban que la salvación sólo venía por un conocimiento especial de Dios, disponible sólo para unos cuantos. Ireneo, además de maestro fue un gran pacificador, pues concilió las tensiones entre oriente y occidente en lo referente a la celebración de la Pascua, en la primera luna llena de la primavera. Movido por la necesidad, aprende los idiomas de la región de Francia y Alemania y va allá como su obispo, en medio de la persecución, donde a la postre, murió como mártir

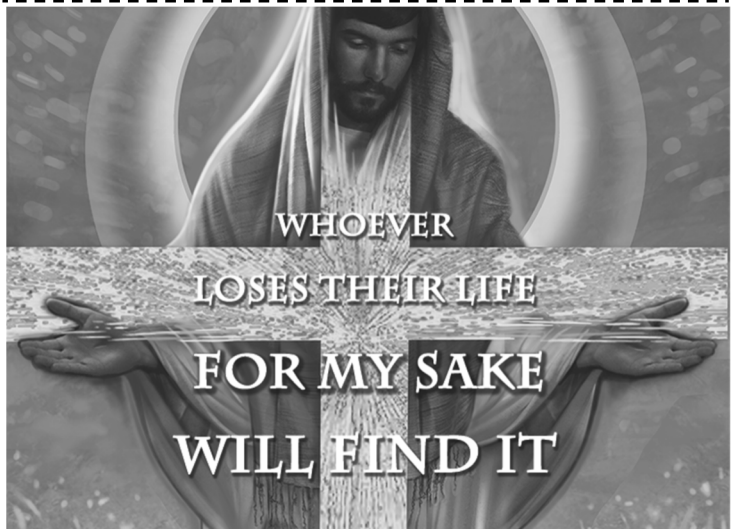

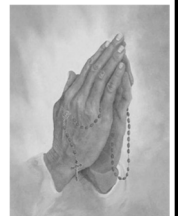

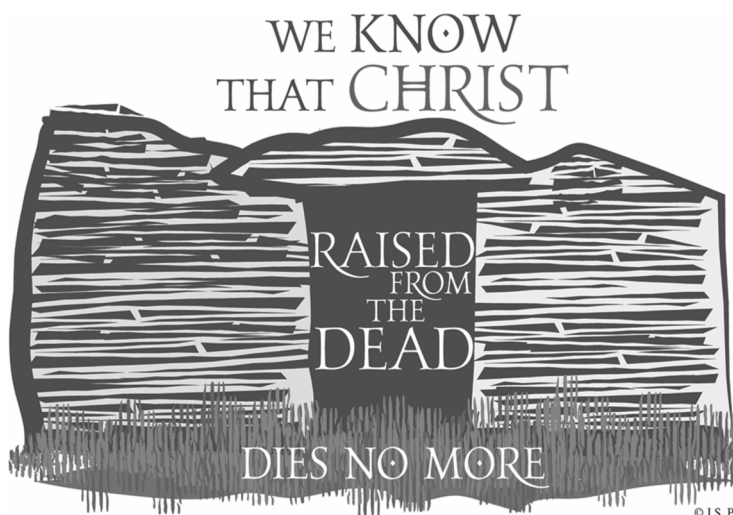

Holy Mother Church in Her liturgical tradition has ascribed to different days of the week particular focal points for reflection.

We see, for example, that Sundays honor Christ's Resurrection; Mondays, the Holy Spirit and holy souls in Purgatory. Tuesdays lay claim to the Holy Angels, and Thursdays are devoted to the Blessed Sacrament and thus the Holy Priesthood. Fridays are dedicated to Christ's Passion and to His Sacred Heart, while Saturdays honor Our Lady, because it was on Holy Saturday that She waited in joyful hope with the fearful disciples for the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

Holy Mother Church has given Wednesday, "the day the week turns on"—as author David Clayton highlights in his book *The Little Oratory*—to St. Joseph. This means that the middle of the week is the perfect time to reflect on, be grateful for, and intercede on behalf of holy fatherhood, both spiritual and biological.
